Must take if you're interested in insurance--and be sure to get to know Persons. 2 The exam for this class was not at all proportional to the rest of the semester. Feb 20, 2012 2:36 PM While class was low stress (met once a week and students volunteered to participate), the exam was much harder than expected. It was a 2 hour in-class multiple choice/true false/fill-in-the-blank exam AND a take-home ten page essay portion. Not really worth it unless you want to go into insurance practice. 3 This class was way too much work for a 2 hour class, and it was extremely Feb 15, 2012 4:49 PM boring. The final consisted of a take home and an in class essay, which is ridiculous. I would not recommend this class to anyone. 4 The class material was moderately useful, but the instruction was not. We had Feb 13, 2012 10:04 AM rather long reading assignments for a 2 hour course, and then we would regurgitate what we just read, in a slow, dry manner. I was not a fan. 5 Possibly the most boring professor I have taken in law school. It's a 2 hour class, Feb 12, 2012 7:34 PM and he assigns 2 exams. Way too much work for the credit you will receive. If you have a burning desire to take insurance, do it. If not, steer clear and find some other schedule filler. 6 This classed sucked gorilla taint. For a two credit course, it was waaaay too Feb 8, 2012 2:47 PM much work. He assigned about 70-80 pages of reading per week. We had a closed book two hour exam, AND an open-book 2 week exam with 4 very complicated and difficult essay questions. Also, he doesn't give many As. Also, the Person knows a ton about practicing insurance law but he's terrible at teaching. 7 Even though this is only a two hour class, we had an in-class fill in the blank Feb 6, 2012 8:15 PM exam without an outline (over things we didn't ever talk about in class) AND a take home portion. The take home was the most absurd thing ever and was completely unfair, as we had never done any problems in class and thus were completely without the skills to complete the problems. Do not take this class unless you want to go into insurance law 8 This is the most work you will ever do for 2 hours worth of credit. Readings per Feb 6, 2012 8:07 PM week are approximately 75 pages of dense materials. He will expect you to have read it in its entirety. Further, the exam is horrendous. There is an out of class and an in class exam. The out of class exam is 4 essay questions that will require DAYS for you to answer correctly while remaining within the very strict page limits. Then, there is an in-class, closed book exam consisting of multiple choice and fill in the blank questions that are very specific. If you're going to be practicing insurance law, it is a worthwhile class. Otherwise, it is not worth the excessive workload for the 2 credit hours. 9 Class can be fairly boring at times, but Persons doesn't cold call, so you don't Feb 6, 2012 8:31 AM have to worry about being very prepared for class. The grade for the class is based on a take home exam with four essays limited to a total of ten pages as well as an in class multiple choice/true false/fill in the blank exam.
